

INVITATION TO COMMENT ON TARIFF APPLICATIONS FOR PETROLEUM PIPELINE LOADING AND STORAGE FACILITIES

The National Energy Regulator of South Africa (NERSA or 'the Energy Regulator') is a regulatory authority established as a juristic person in terms of Section 3 of the National Energy Regulator Act, 2004 (Act No. 40 of 2004). The Energy Regulator's mandate is to regulate the electricity, piped-gas and petroleum pipelines industries in terms of the Electricity Regulation Act, 2006 (Act No. 4 of 2006), Gas Act, 2001 (Act No. 48 of 2001) and Petroleum Pipelines Act, 2003 (Act No. 60 of 2003).

The Energy Regulator invites the public to comment on the following tariff applications:

- **Bidvest Tank Terminals (Pty) Ltd's** tariff application for its petroleum loading and storage facilities in Richards Bay – 1 April 2020 to 23 June 2023 tariff period;
- **Burgan Cape Terminals (Pty) Ltd's** tariff application for its petroleum loading and storage facilities in Cape Town - 1 January 2020 - 31 December 2022 tariff period; and
- **Easigas (Pty) Ltd's** tariff application for its petroleum storage facility in Durban - 1 January 2020 – 31 December 2020 tariff period.

Stakeholders and members of the public are invited to submit written comments on the tariff applications.
